




A total of 1,496 people responded to the online English language survey; 3 people responded to the online Spanish language survey; and a total of 116 people filled out paper surveys.




Site Plan | Dodge Street Level



























Building Architecture | North Elevation
















Building Architecture | East Building Section
























DOUBLE COLLECTION CAPACITY






Building Interior | Lower Level Plan












Building Interior | First Level Plan

























Building Interior | Second Level Plan


















